MORE RIGOROUS CRITERIA ON THE WAY FOR ISSUE OF GOLD (SUPERVISORY) SKILLCARDS

The introduction of more rigorous criteria for the issue of Gold SKILLcards to supervisory personnel (i.e., Foremen and First-line Supervisors) will ensure that, in future, the regime reflects the requirements of main contractors which are in membership of the UK Contractors Group (UKCG).

In the short term, this process has resulted in a revision of the arrangements whereby Gold (Supervisory) SKILLcards can be achieved via industry accreditation ("grandfather rights").

Industry accreditation will now remain in place for an additional 12 months – ie, until 31 October 2011 – and Gold (Supervisory) SKILLcards applied for before the end of February 2011 will be valid for the full five years.

However, Gold (Supervisory) SKILLcards that are issued on the basis of industry accreditation on or after 1 March 2011 will remain valid only until 31 October 2012.

From 1 November 2011, in order to qualify for a Gold (Supervisory) SKILLcard, individuals will be expected to have undertaken a recognised short course in supervisory management – such as the HVCA's *Building Better Business Skills* Institute of Leadership and Management course. Details of other courses that will satisfy this requirement will be published separately.

With effect from 1 November 2012, applicants for a Gold (Supervisory) SKILLcard will have to satisfy more rigorous occupational competence requirements, the details of which will be published in due course.

In addition to meeting these progressively more rigorous requirements in respect of occupational competence, SKILLcard applicants will at all times be expected to satisfy SKILLcard's health and safety criteria as set out in the attached table.

SKILLcard News and Information Bulletin 33 deals separately with the ongoing industry accreditation criteria for managerial occupations.

INDUSTRY ACCREDITATION EXTENDED FOR MANAGERIAL OCCUPATIONS

For Managerial personnel, Industry Accreditation (through an employer's endorsement) was provisionally due to come to an end on 31 October 2010.

It has recently been decided that this closure date should be extended by a further 12 months to 31 October 2011.

The managerial occupations covered by SKILLcard are:

- Contracts Manager
- Design Engineer
- Project Engineer
- Project Manager
- Quantity Surveyor
- Service and Maintenance Manager

Separate arrangements are in place for **Building Services Engineers** who are members of CIBSE – see the SKILLcard website for details.

Employer's Endorsement — Statements of Competences

Health and Safety Training Course for Supervisors and Managers

In line with this extension, the implementation of mandatory health and safety testing for supervisors and managers has also been deferred. This means that, to qualify for a SKILLcard, *Managerial personnel* may continue — until further notice — to satisfy the health and safety criteria of SKILLcard by undertaking a SKILLcard/CITB-ConstructionSkills health and safety test or a designated health and safety training course, as indicated below:

SKILLcard FEES — INCREASE IN RATE OF VAT

As a result of the imminent increase of the rate of VAT to 20 per cent, SKILLcard fees from 1 January 2011 will be as follows:

- The cost of all SKILLcards will be £25.50;
- Card upgrades will cost £7.15; and
- Replacement cards will cost £9.20.

The fees quoted are inclusive of VAT at the rate of 20 per cent.
